

Elton John, Brandi Carlile & Elizabeth Taylor Offer Emergency HIV Support

The Elizabeth Taylor AIDS Foundation launches an emergency HIV grant cycle. Plus: Elton John and Brandi Carlile team up to raise funds.

It's a Code Red situation for many [HIV](#) service providers as they lose vital funding under the Trump administration and find themselves targeted in attacks against diversity, equity and inclusion. But help is on the way thanks to two of the biggest names in the history of [AIDS advocacy](#)—Elton John and Elizabeth Taylor.

The [Elizabeth Taylor AIDS Foundation \(ETAF\)](#) is launching a competitive grant cycle to offer financial assistance to domestic HIV programs in need. Specifically, the grants will be awarded to programs that support transgender HIV services and wellness and those that offer wraparound health services to women and youth. Applications are being accepted until May 31.

“We recognize that many nonprofit organizations and initiatives rely heavily on government funding, and we are committed to helping them navigate these unforeseen challenges. Many HIV service organizations will face unexpected financial hurdles due to the recent policy changes, and it is crucial that we respond swiftly,” said ETAF executive director Cathy Brown [in a statement](#).

Meanwhile, Rocket Man [Elton John](#) has teamed up with alternative country rocker Brandi Carlile to raise funds for global HIV efforts. Carlile’s Looking Out Foundation is supporting the [Elton John AIDS Foundation](#)’s “Who Believes in Angels?” campaign by matching all donations up to \$100,000. This means your gift will be doubled—but you must act fast, as the offer ends shortly after midnight Thursday, April 17.

One of the best-known AIDS advocates in the world, John has parlayed his fame and connections to raise HIV funds and awareness for decades. His 2025 Oscar party raised \$8.6 million; the annual event has raised over \$123 million since 1992. From the early days of the AIDS epidemic in the 1980s, Hollywood icon Elizabeth Taylor was one of the first and most prominent celebrities to speak out for people with AIDS and to raise funds for research and supportive services. She died in 2011 at age 79, but her legacy endures through the annual Elizabeth Taylor Ball to End AIDS and other events.
