[Black Americans](#) have the highest incidence (20% higher than most other groups) and mortality rates (40% higher) for this type of [cancer](#) in the United States, according to the [Colorectal Cancer Alliance](#).

To raise awareness and funds for [colorectal cancer](#), the grandmaster of dope derrière beats has teamed up with Meta-X studios to sell 6,666 unique hand-drawn “Bit Butt” NFTs (aka nonfungible tokens, a form of digital artwork). Each sale, [according to BitButts.com](#), “triggers a contribution to support colorectal cancer research and education.”

What’s more, the campaign points out, just as in real life, each Bit Butt is spectacular and unique. Each one is minted at the same price, but some are rarer and more valuable than others. Blue is the official color for colorectal cancer awareness and prevention, and 50 of the 6,666 Bit Butts will be designated as Blue Butts—some of the rarest in the collection.

The campaign officially launches May 9—including an NFT remix of “Baby Got Back”—but you can get off your can and visit [BitButts.com](#) now for first crack at the NFTs and other goodies. “When the team at META-X showed me what they were doing, it was a no-brainer for me,” said Sir Mix-A-Lot in a [Deadline article on the campaign](#). “And as an artist entering this new medium of NFTs, the idea of designing my own branded butts was exciting. Add to it the benefit of raising

funds for a great cause like colorectal cancer, and wow! I hope everyone enjoys grabbing onto some nice NFT booty while helping others at the same time.”

March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. [According to the Colorectal Cancer Alliance](#), it’s estimated that 151,030 people will be diagnosed with colorectal cancer this year and 52,580 people will die of the disease.

In addition, colorectal cancer is the third most commonly diagnosed cancer in men and women combined in the United States and the second leading cause of cancer death in men and women.
